Registration Process

NEW STUDENTS: Register for classes by scheduling an appointment with your advisor. To set up your RC email account, go to my.rc.edu and set up your account as a new user. Under the Login button, go to "Forgot password? New User? Click here." If you need additional assistance, please email helpdesk@rc.edu.

CONTINUING STUDENTS:

- **Students may register or make course changes online, for one academic year at a time. However, discussing course selection and course changes with an advisor is highly recommended, as such changes may impact your anticipated graduation date.**
- Students should meet with their advisor prior to the start of each academic year. You may select your classes for the full academic year and register at that meeting. This ensures a seat in your desired courses, and prevents disruption of your graduation timetable. You may view or print your schedule at any time by going to the Student

Portal at my.rc.edu, and select [My Schedule](#). **NOTE: Always check your schedule immediately prior to the start of class, to confirm location, day and time of classes.**

- To register or make changes to your schedule online, go to the Student Portal at my.rc.edu. After the online registration window has closed (the day before session A starts each semester), students must submit the Course Add/Drop/Withdrawal form located on the Student Portal under [Online Applications and Forms](#). See the FAQ located under [Registration](#), Downloads, Online Registration Tools if you have questions. **Note:** Course change fees may apply.
- To receive a copy of your updated degree plan, please contact your advisor.
- Students are responsible for meeting all pre-requisites and co-requisites. Rochester College reserves the right to administratively drop students from courses for which they do not meet requirements.

New Student Orientation and Information Literacy

All new students are required to take New Student Orientation online in their first semester at Rochester College. New Student Orientation will open approximately one week prior to the start of the semester. Students who start at RC prior to Fall 2017 are required to take Information Literacy by their second semester at RC. Information Literacy is an eight-week course that introduces students to the Rochester College Code of Academic Integrity, APA style writing format, scholarly research, and research tools and instruments provided by RC.

Online Course Information

- First time online students and all new RC students **are required to participate in the WEB 1000 MOODLE Orientation** accessible from the Home page of our online learning system, Moodle. You may find Moodle at <http://online.rc.edu/> or through the [Online Courses](#) link at the top of the Student Portal at my.rc.edu. Logon to Moodle with your RC username and password. **Your online courses will appear in Moodle AFTER you complete the Moodle orientation.**
- Online courses are eight weeks in length. An online week runs Saturday to Friday. Students may access an online class any time of the day or night. Be prepared to dedicate more total time to your online course than you would to a once-per-week, in-class course.
- **If a student does not participate in an online class within 14 days of the class start date, they will be administratively dropped from that class.** Participation is defined as completing an assignment or engaging in class discussion. Viewing the syllabus, updating bio information, or asking an instructor a question does not constitute participation.
- Students must be comfortable working with technology and a computer. This means students should be able to work with files (download, save, edit, attach), use Internet browser(s), and understand basic computer security features such as pop-up blockers.
- Please ensure that you have the following:
 - ✓ A computer with at least a 1GHz processor and audio speakers
 - ✓ Microsoft Word® processing software (version 97-2003 **or higher**)
 - ✓ Internet connection (high-speed recommended; for videos, a minimum of 300 Kbps + is needed)
 - ✓ Rochester College computer username and password (emailed to students at enrollment)

Textbook Information

Textbooks are not sold on campus. RC partners with MBS Direct, the largest online college bookstore system in the nation, to provide textbooks to our students. MBS Direct offers new and used books, e-books and book rentals. Their site includes textbook titles, ISBNs, and pricing. You may access the site at campusstore.rc.edu.

If your financial aid covers the cost of your textbooks, you may request a voucher to buy books via MBS Direct. Once you register and Student Financial Services confirms your aid, a voucher ID will be sent to your RC email. When ordering from MBS Direct, enter the voucher ID to purchase books. If you have a credit balance, you may request a voucher to purchase school supplies and sportswear in RC's Campus Store (campusstore.rc.edu) via email from Student Financial Services sfs@rc.edu.

Grades

Grades may be viewed on the student portal at <https://my.rc.edu>, by 5pm on the Tuesday after the session/semester ends, provided you have completed the course evaluation. You will be asked to complete a course evaluation for each class before you may view your grades each semester.

Graduation Applications and Deadlines

Graduation applications may be completed at my.rc.edu under Forms. NOTE: **If you plan to graduate at any point during the 2017-2018 academic year, please complete the graduation application when you register for your last semester.** Graduation applications must be received no later than October 1st for the Fall semester, February 1st for the Spring semester and April 1st for the Summer semester.

Course Drop/Withdrawal Policy and Attendance Policy

Any student who misses the first three class meetings of any class or fails to participate during the first two weeks of an online course will be automatically dropped from the class.

Students who miss more than two sessions (30%) of an 8-week class and do not withdraw by the withdrawal deadline will earn a grade of "F." A "W" will be assigned to any course withdrawn from prior to the course withdrawal deadline. In the event a class meets only seven times because of a holiday, students may only miss one time without failing the course.

Class withdrawals must be submitted in writing. To register or make changes to your schedule online, go to the Student Portal at my.rc.edu. After the online registration window has closed (the day before session A starts each semester), students must submit the Course Add/Drop/Withdrawal form located on the Student Portal under Online Applications and Forms. See the FAQ located under Registration, Downloads, Online Registration Tools if you have questions. **Note:** Course change fees may apply. Requests must be received on or before the last date to withdraw (listed in the table below). Requests to be withdrawn from a course after these deadlines will not be honored.

Financial Aid Awards and Billing

- Students must complete and submit a FAFSA for each award year. Complete the application at fafsa.ed.gov. RC School Code is 002288. Once the Student Financial Services Office receives your FAFSA, an award letter will be emailed to you.
- Students may accept or deny financial aid awards at my.rc.edu under Financial Services, My Award Letter. Any adjustments or cancellation of aid must be submitted by the student, in writing via their RC student email account, to the Student Financial Services Office at sfs@rc.edu.
- Students may view their billing statement via my.rc.edu under My Billing Ledger.
- Students are not required to make payment during initial registration; however, Fall semester payment is due on or before **August 25, 2017**, Spring is due on or before **January 5, 2018**, and Summer is due on or before **April 27, 2018**.
- Students may select the appropriate intended payment method by going to My Billing Ledger. Payment options for balances due after financial aid include: Pay in Full, Payment Plan, and/or Third Party. Payment in full or the first installment of the payment plan for the Fall is due by **August 25, 2017**, Spring is due by **January 5, 2018**, and Summer is due by **April 27, 2018**.
- Personal Payment Plan Due Dates: If part or all of your account is to be paid through a payment plan, a \$70 payment plan fee will be assessed and a three-month payment schedule will be provided. A \$45 late payment fee will be assessed for each missed or late payment. The payment plan due dates are as follows:
 - Fall 2017: 8/25/17, 9/20/17, 10/20/17
 - Spring 2018: 1/5/18, 2/20/18, 3/20/18
 - Summer 2018: 4/27/18, 5/20/18, 6/20/18
- **It is vital that you review your Financial Aid and Billing in the Student Portal on a regular basis. A list of what is needed, the student's Award Letter, and the Billing Ledger are on the Student Portal.**
- **To check your financial aid and billing online:**
 - 1) Check Document Tracking – This will list any items needed prior to Rochester College offering you financial aid. All forms are located in the Student Portal under Financial Services>Financial Forms. If no items are listed in Document Tracking, proceed to step 2.
 - 2) Check Financial Services> “My Award Letter” for terms for the Fall of 2017, Spring of 2018, and Summer of 2018. This is where you will go to complete your Financial Award Letter. The Student Financial Services office will also email a letter that explains your eligibility.
 - 3) Check “My Billing Ledger” to view your account balance and to choose how you would like to pay for any unpaid balance. If the “Overall Balance” is in parenthesis, your bill is completely covered with financial aid and you have a credit on your account. Credit balances are mailed to the student in the form of a refund check once all financial aid is posted to your account.
